

How to write logical essay paragraphs?

An essay is a piece of clear and focused writing that expresses a writer's opinion and ideas about a topic. You might have to write different types of essays in your academic journey. One of these types of essays is a logical essay. A logical essay is an essay that is based upon a smooth and coherent flow of thoughts. In a logical essay, a writer needs logical reasoning to build an argument. You will need to provide a clear and well-structured picture of your opinion or main points. A good logical essay keeps the readers on a track rather and it piques their interest rather than confusing them.



A logical essay is based on the crafting of the writer's stance or main argument in a logical sequence in each paragraph of the essay. It might prove to be a difficult task, as the aim of the essay is to make it easier for the readers to easily follow the logic presented by the writer. However, with the help of a trained [Essay help](#), writing a logical essay would not be an obstacle to getting good grades. While converting your logical syllogisms into the main arguments, you must follow these steps.

1. provide a premise that indicates your stance,
2. provide evidence that supports your stance,
3. draw a clear connection between the premise and the conclusion.

Steps for writing logical essay paragraph:

Step 1 - Analyze the topic

First of all, conduct thorough research to identify and analyze the underlying meaning of your essay topic. Thoroughly study what your topic is revolving around. Analyze every reasonable viewpoint to the core so that it may help you in answering the questions related to your topic. Arrange the already discovered ideas in order of importance. Subsequently, it will lead your topic towards various angles that would shape your essay in perfect form.

Step 2 - Construct a thesis statement

At this stage, you must be in a position to write your own stance on the topic more clearly. Based on the preliminary research, construct a strong thesis statement, which will help you in outlining the essay.

Step 3 - Formulate a structural outline

This step must show a detailed picture of what you are planning to demonstrate in your essay. You may use order of importance for the arrangement of paragraphs, which means a logical division of different aspects or ideas related to your topic. It can also be defined as, establishing an order of events in the sequence of most important to least important or vice versa. Another form of order is to arrange the ideas from general to a specific idea, such as shaped like a diamond or adopt the opposite way, from a specific to the general point of view.

Outline the paragraphs in such a manner that each paragraph consists of only one idea. However, each paragraph should be inter-linked to another paragraph in a logical order. Thus, the well-connected paragraphs will result in a good logical essay, which will enable you to present your opinion to the readers more clearly.

Step 4 - Follow a logical order for the paragraphs

Since the essay must have a logical flow of thought in each paragraph, therefore, you must pay attention to the organizational structure of the essay. For this purpose, you must arrange the arguments in a logical division. You can follow a chronological order in which you can write your arguments in the order of strongest to weakest. This will enable you to shape the readers' perceptions in the support of your arguments. That is what I do to when I have to [help write my essay](#). But If you are unable to figure out the logical order, make sure you ask professionals to write your essay for you, they can help you organize your arguments and essay.

Step 5 - Follow a logical order for the sentences in a paragraph

After sorting out the paragraph structure, you will need to organize the sentences of each paragraph to be arranged in a logical order. A random order or sequence of sentences would probably leave the reader in confusion. Therefore, you can follow the TEAR paragraph structure. The first part of the paragraph must be a Topic sentence, which consists of a premise and followed by a conclusion. A topic sentence is the fortuneteller of the paragraph that gives your reader an idea of what you will discuss in this paragraph. The second part contains evidence to support the premise. The third part contains your Analysis and the fourth part must be aimed at Relating-back the paragraph to the main argument.

You will also have to use some transitional words to set up the paragraph in a logical order. Writing and arranging logical paragraphs might seem like a difficult job but remember, a professional [Persuasive essay writing](#) can be contacted to help you save your grades and time.

Step 6 - Conclude the essay

The closing paragraph of an essay is vital for the readers to understand the overall argumentation in a single paragraph. After logically arranging the essay, the concluding paragraph must also elaborate on a logical ending. In this step, you will have to tie all knots of the essay in such a style that the readers get to know a whole summary of all the arguments presented in the essay. However, no new addition should be made to this paragraph.

Proofread and revise the essay before the submission and watch out for grammatical errors. Fallacies are common when one is writing a paragraph in a logical order. Therefore, you must know what fallacies are, and what strategies you would need to avoid making fallacies.
